FRAUD ALERT: "Smishing" Scam





The Office of the State Auditor (OSA) and the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) are warning against fraudsters perpetuating "smishing" scams to steal the identities of New Mexicans. "Smishing" is an identity theft scheme that uses cellphone text messaging technology to scam recipients. Cellular fraud, according to the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) is the "unauthorized use, tampering or manipulation of cellular phone or service" , is a favored information harvesting method used by fraudsters.

Upon information received from the MVD, the Office of the State Auditor (OSA) is warning New Mexicans to be aware of fraudsters using text messages to scam residents. The MVD is reporting the text messages

appear to be an attempt to steal social security numbers and other personal identifying information.
